Dear Colleagues,

The European Pediatric Surgeon's Association (EUPSA) has the pleasure to announce the 12th Central & Eastern European Course in Pediatric Surgery on the topic of "Neonatal & Minimal Invasive Surgery" in Lviv, Ukraine.

Every year the city is visited by more than 1.5 million tourists.

In general, Ukraine is now in a important period of formation. After the events of the Revolution of Dignity in 2014, Ukraine started a series of reforms that were aimed at the final change from post-Soviet remnants to the modern European platforms. One of these changes is the reform of the healthcare system that began in 2018. Ukraine is keen to become a full member of the European Union and to belong to Europe not only geographically but also civilizationally. The "12th Central & Eastern European Course in Pediatric Surgery" has an important educational, scientific and social mission – it promotes faster integration of Ukrainian doctors into a friendly European family of children's surgeons.

#### Travel information and Hotel accommodation

Lviv Airport (Airport code LWO) is situated on Lyubinska str. just 6 km from the city center. There are daily flights to Lviv from Warsaw, Munich, Vienna, Istanbul, Minsk, Kyiv. International airlines operate regular flights from Rome, Madrid, Berlin, London, Bratislava, Wroclaw, Krakow, Bologna, Gdansk etc. Check the detailed schedule on the airport website: *https://lwo.aero/en/schedule*.

Public transport is provided by trams, trolleybuses, buses. Taxis are available throughout the city. For the sake of convenience and fare's predictability you can also use Uber app or its Ukrainian rival Uklon.

The unit of currency is the "hryvnia" (sign: €, code: UAH). The hryvnia is subdivided into 100 kopiyky. ATM's (known as "bankomats") and currency exchanges ("obmin valyut") are ubiquitous throughout Lviv. Many hotels and restaurants take Visa and MasterCard.

Lviv is a tourist destination and offers over 100 hotels in all price categories. Hotels can be booked through travel services: (booking.com/ expedia.com/ hotels.com/ airbnb.com etc.).
